The Western Coventry Fire Department has considered the request to use funds from the opioid settlement and we will accept funding to procure medication and equipment to improve our ambulance service license from EMT-Cardiac to EMT-Paramedic. In addition, our Engine Company is currently licensed to provide service at the EMT-Basic level and we will procure equipment that will allow the Engine to perform at the EMT-Cardiac level. The department is staffed with five EMT-Paramedics, six EMT-Cardiacs, and thirteen EMT-Basics.

To operate our rescue vehicle at the EMT-Paramedic level we will need to procure approximately 30 new medications, an Intravenous Pump, an automatic ventilator, specialized paramedic level equipment, new medication bags, and a new medical equipment bag.

To operate our Engine company at the EMT-Cardiac level we will need to procure some additional medications to add to our current inventory, another heart monitor/defibrillator, a new medication bag, Intraosseous Infusion Equipment, a new medical equipment bag, a medication logbook and lock box for controlled medications, and a small refrigerator to store medication that needs to be kept cool.

We are also requesting a new chest compression device for our Engine since it will be operating at the EMT-Cardiac level to help support CPR calls which often occur with opioid overdoses.

The cost of this equipment is \$60,680.00 and the cost breakdown is listed below:

The cost to provide Paramedic level service equipment (Level A-1P as defined by RI EMS Ambulance Licensure and Inspection Manual) is detailed below:

Tetracaine 0.5% (Ophthalmic), Tranexamic Acid (injectable), and Vecuronium (injectable).


